

UBarU Camp & Retreat Center 2021 Summer Youth Camps & COVID

Will camp open in 2021? - Our plan is to open camp with COVID precautions and adaptations. However, the reality is that with changing restrictions, vaccine availability and evolving federal and state guidance, patience and flexibility is appreciated. Spaces may be limited due to a planned decrease in capacity. Refunds will be offered in the event of cancellation by UBarU and refunds or credits will be offered if you decide to cancel.

What are the pre-camp expectations? - Please quarantine for 2 weeks prior to camp in order to reduce exposure which means staying home, washing hands, and wearing a mask when interacting with anyone outside your household. Please have a COVID test done 3-5 days prior to camp starting. Please bring the test result with you to camp. If the camper has a positive test, please stay home and get well.

What will be camp capacity in 2021? - Capacity will be reduced by approximately 40-50% for the number of campers on-site.

How will check-in procedures change?- We will take the temperature of the camper and adult while in the vehicle. We will

review your COVID questionnaire and test results before beginning additional check-in.

What precautions and behavior changes will be

expected at camp? -Campers and their designated adult counselors who stay in the same Suite will be considered a Pod. Everyone will be encouraged to eat outdoors in their pods as well as practice good hand hygiene. Additional cleaning of high-touch surfaces will occur. Campers and staff are expected to wear mask/facial coverings, physically distance from others as able, preference outdoors to indoors when able and stay home if ill prior to camp.

What happens if someone has a fever (a possible symptom of COVID), loss of taste/smell or a positive test while at camp?

- The individual who has the fever, loss of taste/smell or other symptom will be quarantined. They may be tested with a point-of-care test at camp (if available) and parents/guardians will be notified to arrange pick up of the camper. If the individual is a staff member, they will be sent home. The symptomatic camper's pod will be isolated from other campers in a cottage. All campers and staff will continue to be temperature checked daily. If a (+) test result is reported, all parents will be emailed.

Will vaccines be mandatory for camp? - We encourage staff and campers to get vaccinated, but it will not be mandatory. Those who are vaccinated will still be expected to wear a mask , physically distance and comply with COVID precautions. Campers are asked to quarantine for 2 weeks prior to starting camp and have a negative test within 3-5 days of camp starting. Similarly, staff will be asked to quarantine for 2 weeks prior to camp and have a negative test within 3-5 days of arriving at camp.

Will there be an online camp? - If we decide to cancel in-person camp, we will consider an online camp option.
